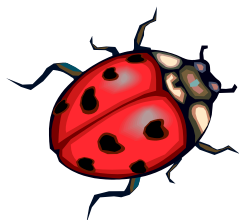

1 can crushed pineapple
 1 can cherry pie filling
 1 box yellow cake mix
 ½ lb margarine
 ½ c nuts

In a 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan, spread pineapple. Spread cherry pie filling over pineapple. Sprinkle DRY cake mix evenly over fruit. Sprinkle mix with nuts. Cut margarine into cubes and evenly sprinkle over mix. Bake at 350 F for 40-55 minutes or until nicely browned. Serve warm or at room temperature.

 9 – 6” squares
 6 – 5.5” squares
