

Quilting in the Pines VIII - September 21st & 22nd, 2018

DEFINITIONS

Art quilt – a totally original work by the maker without assistance of an instructor or pattern, innovative in its construction, materials or design techniques. It must not be a reproduction of a previous work. All work must be done by the entrant, including quilting.

Bed quilt – intended for use on a bed: Twin, Double, Queen or King.

Challenge quilt – A quilt complying with the rules for the Sandhills Quilters Guild Challenge in 2018.

First judged quilt – a first quilt entered for judging in any quilt show

Group quilt – three or more persons were involved in its completion including quilting by someone other than the maker(s) of the quilt top.

Junior quilt – a quilt made by a quilter under 18 years of age. The Junior may receive assistance with the quilting and/or binding.

Lap/throw/crib – a smaller than bed size quilt used as a cover This would include crib quilts as well.

Miniature – a quilt completely scaled down in all features from a large pieced, appliqued or whole cloth quilt design, no larger than 24" on a side and with block size not exceeding 4".

Miscellaneous – any quilted item not included in another category. Items appropriate for this category could include table and bed runners, quilted clothing, tree skirts, tote bags and mantle scarves.

One-party quilt – Only one person made the top and did the quilting on the quilt.

Two-party quilt – Two people involved in the completion of the quilt including quilting by someone other than the maker of the top.

Wall quilt – a quilt intended for display on a wall.

TECHNIQUES:

Pieced – predominant technique is piecing by hand, machine or both.

Appliqued – predominant technique is applique by hand, machine, or both

Mixed – a fairly even balance of piecing and applique with neither dominating the finished quilt.

Other – one or more special techniques used to develop the design of the top such as whole cloth, cathedral window, embroidery, crazy quilting, paint, ink, surface texture from fabric manipulation, etc.

CATEGORIES: Further subdivisions of some categories may be made based on technique and size if entry numbers warrant.
